Meeting called to order at 6:05pm

- 3. Board Trustee Representative Lorraine Stewart's Report

Discussion regarding possible future boundary changes. There has not yet been a motion to board meeting for senior administrators to look at boundaries. Likely no changes will occur this year.

- 4. Principal's Message Mr. Archie Lillico
 - a. Mr Archie Lillico's Report
 - i. Parent teacher interviews went well on the 3rd and the 5th. Report cards will be going live on line December 3rd if access online is not available to families please let the office know and they will print a copy for you.
 - ii. Next date for the students in option 2 programming to return to school is January 4th.
 - iii. Milk program is doing so well we increased the order amounts and we have done the same with the Nutrition Nook.
 - iv. Hot lunch ran its first day on the 4th of November and by all reports, super successful. We are currently the only school that I can find, that is running a cooked program within the school.
 - v. Next COSC meeting is November 19th and it is again online.
 - vi. Remembrance day was set up and run by Mrs. Milne. She and the students did a wonderful job. Readers were from grade 4 and taped, as well she was able to get us a message from our troops overseas. It was very moving.
 - vii. We are approximately 5 weeks from Christmas break. The Parkland Village School Foundation has gifted the school with money to do a Christmas craft in each grade. We are exploring that currently and hope to have the students working on that the first week of December. Each grade will have their own craft to do.
 - viii. Mrs Milne and myself took the two day Standard First Aid during Fall break. Mrs. Ash-Elliott, Mrs. Palmer and Mrs. Dworak will have their emergency first aid by the end of November. Mrs. Kramshoj will renew her Standard First Aid by the end of November as well.
 - ix. I had indicated that I would have a draft of the school plan for us to go over but was ill prior to our break and will supply this at the January meeting.





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- b. Nutrition Nook food choices will be requested to increase available cheddar and marble cheese as it is utilized the most by students. Muffins and boiled eggs are not being consumed as quickly as last year.
- c. Review that many teachers may not know that there is extra meals at no charge available during hot lunch for students in need. Will be reviewed with new teachers.
- d. Discussion if additional help could be brought in for school wide hot lunch. No additional person's will be allowed into school due to COVID-19 concerns
- e. Clarification to hot lunch personnel will be provided to them at later date regarding distribution of school wide hot lunches and possible teacher roles.
- 5. Teacher Representative Mrs. Nicole Blanchet
 - a. Students seem to be doing well with split classes.
 - b. Morale seems high with kids despite Covid-19 regulations and related concerns.
- 6. School Council Board Update Shannon Auger, Chantelle de Boer
 - a. COSC update, Oct 22nd meeting attended by Chantelle de Boer, Shannon Auger and Lindsay Kueklen.
 - i. All other schools have outsourced hot lunch program, PVS only school that has homemade hot lunches.
 - ii. Annual reporting is due for all schools at end of year. Many schools are not completing reports on time. Parkland Village School is one of only a few that completed the report for the 2019-2020 school year.
 - iii. Provincial Aptitude Testing will occur for most schools (PAT's). Will be testing Math and Literacy
 - iv. Recommended to place a link on school website to ASCA website Mr. Lillico will request this be completed.

Board Meeting Updates:

October 27, 2020

- Check the Board Highlights that are posted on the PSD Website: https://www.psd70.ab.ca/view.php?action=object&id=23557&stream=Homepage%20News
- We had a delegation highlighting the Staff Wellness Initiative in Parkland School Division there is energy and effort put to attending to staff wellness in a coordinated manner with the Alberta Teachers Association, Alberta School Employee Benefit Plan and PSD.
- The Board put a request forward to the government for modular classrooms ror:
 Prescott, Millgrove, and Ecole Meridian Heights.
- We received an October 2020 Forecast which is based on September 30 enrolments each year. We are forecasting a balanced budget despite the dollars put into COVIDrelated expenses of \$4.7M for certificated salaries and benefits to support online learning; substitute costs; supplies including sanitizer and PPE, and custodial services and equipment. We received \$4.0M from the federal government for COVID-related expenses. We will continue to monitor and continue to advocate for additional funding to the government.
- We received an Early Learning Report. With the new funding model, there are only 2 years' worth of Program Unit Funding provided prior to Kindergarten. The Kindergarten kids are now included in the Base Instructional Funding and receive the Specialized Learning Support Grant this doesn't equate to the previous PUF. Other difficulties with PUF: eligibility criteria for PUF has changed so that many with language delays are not eligible and there is less funding for those with severe disabilities. PSD has hired a Speech Language Pathologist who provides 6 week blocks of support to a limited number of kids per school. At the Alberta School Boards Association meeting on Monday, we passed a resolution to advocate to the government for increased funding for early learners.

• This year's Bullying Awareness Week is November 16-20, with the theme "Where to Turn."

Fiscal Responsibility:

- We continue to monitor the COVID-related expenses as the year progresses. Communication and Community Relations:
- The work on fostering an understanding of Remembrance Day led by Sherry Milne at PVS was shared with the Board and the video will be shared at the November Board

meeting. Kudos to Sherry for the work on pulling this together.

Stakeholder Engagement:

• We are engaging students on November 27, 2020 remotely to gather their views on their education in PSD schools.
