• Principal's Message – Mr. Todd Hennig's report

- ~ There is to be a monthly character trait focus for our school. The character trait for September is **GRIT**. Discussion on personal grit, what that looks like on a personal level, and modeling that for our students and children. Reminder that the #I indicator of success in life is grit.
- ~ Solid communication with students, staff, and parents is a huge focus. The weekly newsletters with important summaries at the top and important dates down the side is a strong effort to achieve that transparency and communication. Positive feedback so far.
- ~ There are currently 7 classrooms within the school. There is a special focus to encourage and assist those children who struggle with learning difficulties, and a strong emphasis on literacy as a whole.
- ~ School community is encouraged to reach out and ask for help, advice, answers, information, etc. as soon as reasonably possible to facilitate open communication and teamwork.
- ~ Micro-society is not coming back <u>for now</u>. It may be revisited down the road, but currently the barriers include COVID-19 restrictions, large staff turnover, lack of experienced staff available, and tight budget concerns.
- Parent volunteers will hopefully be able to start in October. COVID-19 restrictions may affect this. PVS is currently considered under an outbreak.
